Mr. Wehrer noted that the district is grateful when folks volunteer to mentor Steel Valley students. He recognized **Mr. Wes Lyons** for his partnership with our schools as a mentor. Mr. Lyons is building relationships and setting goals with students at Barrett Elementary School, the Middle School and the Credit Recovery program.

Interim Principal **Melissa Pentin** and Teacher **Traci Churilla** presented the goals of the School Wide Positive Behavior Intervention at the middle school. The program improves academic and behavior outcomes for all students. The Core Team determined that many behavior issues occurred in the hallways last school year. The goal this year is to focus on students in the hallways, and the staff has seen a decline in discipline referrals. Good behavior is rewarded with tickets that students can use in the cafeteria. Teachers also refer students to the Principal's 200 Club.

Director of Academics, Information & Technology Report

Mr. Edward Colebank announced the middle school students would be taking the PSSA field test in writing. PSSA tests will be underway in March. He encouraged parents to be sure students are attending school, getting adequate rest and eating a proper breakfast. The district has provided projectors and screens in all classrooms. SMART Boards will be installed in every elementary Reading classroom K-5. Thirty (30) iPads are being introduced to the middle school math students. A new wide color printer has been installed in the CAD class.
