# **Student Representatives' Reports**

**Ms. Isabella Furrick**, junior student representative to the School Board, announced that Park Elementary students loved eating lunch with the fire fighters, and they learned a lot in their classes during Fire Safety Week. Students enjoyed participating in homecoming week activities, too.

The kindergarteners and 1st graders are excited for Halloween Movie Night on Wednesday and the 2nd, 3rd and 4th graders are looking forward to the Halloween Dance on Friday. Everyone is really looking forward to the parade on Friday!

At Barrett Elementary School, the kindergarten staff is using a new assessment tool ESGI, which allows teachers to gather basic information related to numbers, letters, and colors as well as basic reading and math skills. The MAPS assessment tool is being utilized at the K-2 level in reading and math, and the staff is currently receiving professional development on the full use of the tool.

Barrett students enjoyed a pep rally from the high school band, cheerleaders and football players during homecoming week. They learned about sportsmanship and the value of a good education. The Homestead Fire Department presented a fire safety assembly at Barrett Elementary School, and the students had the opportunity to view the fire trucks and equipment.

Students from Park and Barrett Schools attended a roller skating party at Eden Park Roller Rink earlier in the month, and the evening was successful and well attended.

### **Superintendent's Report**

Mr. Wehrer recognized the middle school students and staff for organizing a collection drive for school supplies for students in Sarasota, Florida, and Houston, Texas, affected by Hurricanes Harvey and Irma in September. The organizers Mrs. MacDonald and Mrs. Ryan Dunmire-Kuftic and their 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> grade students shared the results of their project. The students in the middle school collected 300 pounds of school supplies and held a denim day collecting \$400 to use for shipping the supplies. Mrs. MacDonald has a friend in the Sarasota school system that accepted the supplies on behalf of her school, and Mrs. Dunmire-Kuftic's brother-in-law lives in Houston so he was able to deliver the school supplies to an elementary school. Both schools were thankful for the donations, and the middle school students enjoyed live video Face Time with each other. Kudos to the staff and students for their leadership on this project.
