

Steel Valley School District Board Brief

Board Meeting May 26, 2016

President's Report

She thanked **Charlie Batch** and the **Best of the Batch Foundation** for giving the Barrett students a star-studded banquet with a delicious dinner, photo booth and recognition ceremony. The Best of the Batch Foundation transformed Barrett's gym into a beautiful banquet hall for the families. She also reported that the rededication of West Field was well attended and thanks to all who made the event special.

Student Representative's Report

Student Representative **Abbey Caspar** reported that Barrett Elementary School held a Creativity Fair at its annual Carnival on May 12. More than 100 families experienced science experiments, an Art show, print making, food, carnival games and interactions with local agencies for summer programming opportunities.

The Doris Hyde Merit Day Banquet was sponsored by **BYN Mellon** and the **Best of the Batch Foundation** on May 18. The Best of the Batch volunteers transformed Barrett's gymnasium into the Oscars for the evening. Students and their families were invited to dinner, an awards presentation and a band performance. The event was absolutely spectacular with over 300 people in attendance.
