

Board Meeting September 22, 2009

The Board acknowledged the passing of Nicholas A. # Superintendent's Report

Dr. Kinavey announced that students would be dismissed early on Wednesday, September 23, and classes would be canceled on Thursday and Friday, September 24 & 25, 2009.

Steel Valley employees will participate in National Lee Denim Day on Friday, October 2, to support Breast Cancer Research. Employees are encouraged to donate \$5 to wear denim on that day.

There will be no school for students on Friday, October 23, and Monday, October 26. The faculty and staff will participate in professional development on these days.

Dr. Kinavey congratulated the Marching Band on being Grand Champions at the Preston, West Virginia, band competition.

Dr. Kinavey recognized Mr. Ed Wehrer, Director of the I-TEAM, and staff members who coordinated the I-TEAM summer camp, an educationally focused opportunity for students. 71% of the 2008 summer camp students returned to the 2009 summer camp for a total of 146 students participating. Mr. Wehrer thanked the School Board and the staff for all their help. The School Board thanked Mr. Wehrer for his work and dedication to the students of the Steel Valley School District.

#### Director of Pupil Personnel, Special Services & Elementary Education

Mrs. Borges announced that the Barrett Elementary staff held a breakfast for 1st grade parents/guardians; there were over 200 people in attendance. Grade level breakfasts will be held for parents/guardians throughout the school year. Parents are provided information on strategies to help their children with homework.
