Superintendent's Report

Dr. Kinavey recognized Mrs. Toni Besh, French teacher, for being named an Honoree for the Teacher Excellence Program. Mrs. Besh will be recognized at the Celebration of Teaching Event on April 19 at which time she will learn if she receives one of the \$2,500 grants.

Fourth and fifth grade students showcased the *Freedom Train* program under the direction of teachers Karen Catterall, Lori Kenavey, Sharon Kampe, Student Teacher Robert Saunders and Media Specialist LuAnne Szczypinski. The students learned behind the scenes procedures, worked on public speaking skills, researched and studied the characters they portray through the Readers' Theatre project. Director of Secondary Education

Ms. Bethany Fenyus announced that 51 Middle School students raised \$1,957.46 from the Math-A-Thon to benefit St. Jude Children's Hospital, under the promotion of Mrs. Beth McCallister.

Sixth grader Logan Perry took part in the Regional Spelling Bee at the University of Pittsburgh.

On March 24, five middle school students participated in a National History Day competition at the Heinz History Center. The students performed an original skit based on the Homestead Steel Strike of 1892. Student participants included Kayla Baird as Andrew Carnegie, Alaina Bott as Henry Clay Frick,

Taylor Wellman as Homestead Mayor John McLuckie, Sandra Alhaj as union leader Hugh O'Donnell and Sara Fallon as the narrator. Teachers Mr. Ivan Braszo and Mr. Mark Fallon sponsored the group.

Students who achieve a 3.0 or higher on their report card or progress report are eligible for a 50% discount on a one-month Athletic Club membership at the Carnegie Library of Homestead. Students with a 2.5-2.9 GPA will receive a 33% discount. Students who attend school 30 consecutive days without an unexcused absence or suspensions will receive a 25% discount. This program will begin with the 3rd quarter report card. Guidance counselors will provide students with a certificate to present to the library for the discounted membership. A regular club membership rate is \$30 per month.

A Parents' Night Out is planned for April 12 from 6:30 – 8:30 p.m. in the high school cafeteria. The Student Learning Team, comprised of teachers, parents and administrators is planning an early childhood literacy event for parents and their children.

The Community Leaders Breakfast will be held on April 18 beginning at 8:30 a.m. until 10:00 a.m. in the high school cafeteria. The high school Rhythm Club and students from the Music Technology program will perform. Dr. Kinavey will address the accomplishments of the school district. The proceeds from this event support the Mon Valley Great Idea Grant program.

The Steel Valley Chamber of Commerce honored the Veterans' Day Committee, Mrs. Sharon Fisher, Chief Irvin Williams, Students Melissa Kaufold, Ian Mehok, Sara Fallon and Tyler Votedian at the annual Outstanding Citizens Dinner on March 29.

Ms. Fenyus reported that the PSSA testing went well at the middle school and high school. She thanked the principals, teachers and students for their hard work during testing week. As a reward, 11th graders enjoyed an ice cream social and the 8th graders went on a bowling trip. Various gift certificates, prizes and iPods were raffled off to students with perfect attendance and positive behavior during the testing. Ms. Fenyus thanked Mr. and Mrs. McCallister, Ms. Sabo and Mr. Colebank for their help with the activities and incentives.

Ms. Fenyus distributed on overview of the national and local SAT scores. Out of the 80 students who took the SAT in 2006, 42 students scored higher than the national average on the writing section, 44 students scored higher than the average in reading, and 55 scored higher than the average in math. She reported that the district is partnering to create an SAT tutoring program for students in grades 8-11. In the meantime, students have the opportunity to take the Test-Taking Strategies course at the high school.

National Testing Day is April 28, and in order to encourage students to practice taking the SAT or ACT, the Princeton Review is offering free practice testing at St. Edmund's Academy in Squirrel Hill. Students are encouraged to take this practice test in order to help strengthen standardized test taking skills. Director of Elementary Education

Dr. Policastro reported that she is developing professional development training for Barrett and Park paraprofessionals to assist them with a variety of strategies and resources to support student learning. Elementary Technology Assistants LuAnne Szczypinski and Kevin Tomasic will receive additional Waterford computer training in the areas of math and science.

Kindergarten registration for the 2007-2008 school year is continuing. Parents should contact Mrs. Cain to register their children, and subsequently a student assessment will be scheduled.

Dr. Policastro is working with the elementary principals to develop the framework for aligning the Pennsylvania state standards with the district curriculum.

Student Representatives Reports

Miss Kim Hartnett announced that all 10th grade students completed the Adopt-A-School program and received a certificate of participation from the FBI and law enforcement agencies.

Fifty representatives participated in Career Day on March 8 to assist students with career choices and to help juniors complete their senior projects.

The spring musical Into the Woods was well received by the community as well as the students.

Miss Hartnett reported that 98.7% of the juniors participated in the PSSA tests held March 14-16.

At Barrett Elementary School, fifth grade students have been tutoring second graders two afternoons per week. Fifth graders are paired with second graders who help them practice word lists and stories. The second graders get more practice time and the fifth graders develop a new appreciation of teaching.

On March 10, eleven members of the Barrett Chess Club represented the school at the Carnegie Library Chess tournament. Congratulations to Caleb Groce for taking 2nd place and Amonte Gwinn for his 3rd place award in the elementary division. In addition, the Barrett Chess Club has challenged the administrative staff to a game of chess during recess on April 18, 19 and 20.

Student teacher Ben Laughton taught a lesson on Africa to Mrs. Stokes' third grade class. As a culminating activity and with the help of Ms. Kampe, Mr. Ward from the Carnegie Library brought in his collection of African instruments for all to enjoy.

Law Week will be held April 23-27 at the Middle School and High School. The 8th grade class will be touring Washington, DC, on their annual trip May 10-11.

Previous Board Action

The Board held a public hearing on Act 1 Referendum to increase wage tax for reduction in qualified real estate tax. The Board adopted a resolution approving the referendum question as follows:

Do you favor imposing an additional 0.90% Earned Income Tax? The revenue generated from the increased tax rate will be used to reduce taxes on qualified residential property by an estimated amount of \$283.80. The current Earned Income Tax rate for Steel Valley School District is 0.50%.
