The family center gives out 50 diapers and a pack of wipes per child, per family, every month. If you are interested in receiving diapers please call or stop by.





## **New Head Start Classroom Takes Shape**



The whine of drills and pounding of nails inside a corner of the AlU's Central Office in Homestead will soon be replaced by the laughter of children and the lessons imparted by teachers. The space is being developed into a Head Start classroom that will service more than a dozen preschool-age children and serve as a vital training ground to develop future generations of teaching talent.

"Through close partnerships with Preschool Early Intervention, the class-room will be a place where more seasoned staff can practice and see how to implement strategies to support children with differing abilities," said Wendy Smith, Ed.D., director of Early Childhood Education Services at the AIU.
